The 2022/2023 season was the first relatively "normal" season we have had in a couple of years and what a great season it was.

Our 2022 pool rescue and IRB competitors had a full season of racing during the winter, and they really made up for all the cancelled carnivals from previous years!

Coached by Steph Wilson, our pool rescue team came home with impressive results across their carnivals and finished strong at the Pool Rescue Australian Championships in 9th place overall.

The IRB season saw Kurrawa become 2022 Australian IRB Championships, winning the open category with 3 Gold, 2 Silver and 1 Bronze medal. As a team we achieved the Ocean Roar Premiership and placed second (by 2 points) in the Sharkskin QLD IRB Championships. We also saw 9 of our team represent QLD in the Cyclones and Development team in the Interstate Competition held at the Australian IRB Championships. Thank you to all involved in helping us achieve such successful results.

We sent a small crew of 14 masters competitors to the 2022 Lifesaving World Championships in Riccione, Italy in late September and between them they brought home an impressive 20 gold medals! Representing Australia at Worlds was our beach competitor Britney Ingr who, at just 16 years of age did incredibly well bringing home an individual gold medal in the Youth Female Beach Sprint and two team gold medals.

In 2024 the Lifesaving World Championships will be coming to the Gold Coast with events to be held at Kurrawa Beach, we look forward to welcoming competitors from around the world to our beautiful beach.

A large group of Kurrawa members travelled across the country for the 2023 Australian Championships. 2018 was the last time we were in Perth for Aussies and we wouldn't have been able to get there again without the help of a truck from Nolan's Transport being driven by Brent Coulston and Jim McInerny under the guidance of Kenny Coulston and Paul Crow. These four guys got all our gear to/from Perth safely and we appreciate them doing the long-haul drive across the Nullarbor for us. Thank you! From all reports, 2023 Aussies was a fun, positive experience, and a trip to remember. Huge thanks to our Team Manager extraordinaire Dave Bear, he kept our team informed, organised and happy throughout the event. Thank you to those people who drove the buses daily to ferry people to/from event arenas and everyone else that pitched in to make it a successful trip for all involved. Kurrawa bagged 16 Australian Gold Medals in Perth across the Opens (9th overall) and Masters (3rd overall) events.

We welcomed Guy Andrews as the new Head Coach at the beginning of the season and he has been an incredibly positive addition to the Club. Guy ran a successful program throughout the summer surf season resulting in some excellent results in the water and fantastic morale throughout the crew. In the off season he changed the program up to include ocean paddle races, mountain bike endurance races, ParkRun and plenty of sessions at different locations across the Gold Coast to keep the crew active throughout the colder months.

Thank you to Craig Sly who stepped down as Head Junior Coach at the end of the 2022/23 season. Craig achieved outstanding results whilst coaching our nippers and we saw an increase in numbers in junior competition over the last season.

Thank you to all our surf sports officials, who spend hundreds of hours of volunteering to allow our competitors to do the sport we love. Thank you all for volunteering for Kurrawa. A big thanks to all our helpers, parents and workforce who have helped Kurrawa out this year. The work everyone puts in gets great wraps from people all over Australia. The surf sports events we have run this season has helped put Kurrawa back on the map as the preferred venue for major SLSA events.

Finally thank you to Nick Crilly. Nick's guidance and leadership in surf sports and operations over the last few years has helped Kurrawa become the Club we are today. Nick thank you for all your help personally over the last 12 months, you have certainly had an impact on me and I am grateful to call you a mate.

Unfortunately, due to personal commitments and the cost of travel, the reserve grade men and the under 19 female crews did not compete at the Australian Championships this year. All crews represented the club extremely well at carnivals with strong performances across the board along with handling at times some challenging surf conditions maintaining Kurrawa's strong position in the sport.

The boys performed well throughout the season regularly making finals but unfortunately were not able to match the speed in the flat conditions that presented at Mooloolaba for the State titles. In saying that the boys were strong in and out of the boats, helping out in patrols where needed and were prominent in a rescue early in the season saving a man's life before patrol was set up during a training session.

It is with pleasure that I present the Audited Financial Report of Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc. This year I present two Financial Reports. With the motion passed at the 2022 AGM to change the date of our financial year end to 30 June. This change occurred following approval from the Office of Fair Trading for the amendment to our Constitution and from the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission.

Therefore, I will be presenting the Financials for the three-month period of 1 April 2022 to 30 June 2022 and for the twelve-month period of 1 July 2022 to 30 June 2023.

The financial report for the twelve-month period of 2022-2023 record a total operating Surplus of \$497,072 plus the financial report for the three-month period ended 30 June 2022 recorded a surplus of \$180,177.

The donations received from Kurrawa SLS Supporter's Association Inc. enable the surf club to focus on our published mission:

To be Australia's premier Surf Life Saving Club, servicing the community through a safe beach. With exceptional training and education programs from youth to elite in a fun, family friendly, welcoming and professional environment.

During the twelve-month period to 30 June 2023, donations received from the Supporters Club totalled \$728,591 and for the three-month period it was \$245,000. In addition to this, the Supporters Club donated \$1,074,756 to service the building loan and costs and for the three-month period it was \$268,689. Loan amounts repaid by the Club to the Supporters Club were \$250,000. During the fifteen-month period the total building loans were reduced from \$4,601,774 (2022) to \$3,831,388 (2023).

Total available cash at 30 June 2023 was \$76,387.63

We thank Mr. Ian Barfoot for fastidiously reviewing our financials and completing our audit in a timely fashion for our new reporting timelines.

As always, I would like to thank the Supporters Club, both committee and staff for their hard work and support. Without which we would not operate in the best building and location and have the ability to focus on our service to our members, and the community. I would also like to thank all of our professional office staff whose support to the board and members has allowed for a continued smooth operation and focus on our mission and strategy. In particular, I thank Karen Fleischer whose support and professionalism has greatly supported my role as Treasurer and the governance of the entire club. Karen always operates in the best interest of the Kurrawa and our bottom line. Thank you again Karen for your great service!

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Corporate Information

The financial report is for Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity, incorporated and domiciled in Australia. Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is an association incorporated in Queensland under the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Qld). The association is a charity registered under the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 (Cth).

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – AASB 1060: General Purpose Financial Statements – Simplified Disclosures for For-Profit and Not-for-Profit Tier 2 Entities of the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB) and the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Qld), the Collections Act 1966 (Qld) and the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 (Cth). The association is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements, except for the cash flow information, have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities. The amounts presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

Accounting Policies

a. Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the association is exempt from income tax under Section 50-10 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997* (Cth). Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a Public Benevolent Institution (PBI) and has been endorsed by the Australian Taxation Office to receive tax concessions. Further, Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is endorsed as a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR).

b. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the Statement of Financial Position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are presented as operating cash flows included in receipts from customers or payments to suppliers.

c. Economic Dependence

Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is dependent on the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc for funds used to meet it's financial commitments. At the date of this report the committee members have no reason to believe the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc will not continue to support Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc.

d. Comparative Figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial period. When required, comparative information is reclassified where appropriate to enhance comparability. Note, the current financial period is for three (3) months where the comparative financial period is for twelve (12) months.

e. Revenue

Revenue recognition

Contributed assets

The association receives assets from the government and other parties for nil or nominal consideration in order to further its objectives. These assets are recognised in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable accounting standards (eg AASB 9, AASB 16, AASB 116, AASB 1058 and AASB 138).

On initial recognition of an asset, the association recognises related amounts (being contributions by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer).

The association recognises income immediately in profit or loss as the difference between the initial carrying amount of the asset and the related amount.

Capital grant

Grant revenue received from government that relates to the purchase of capital assets is offset against the amount of the capital asset. The grant is recognised in profit or loss over the life of the depreciable asset as a reduced depreciation expense.

Operating grants, donations and bequests

When the association receives operating grant revenue, donations or bequests, it assesses whether the contract is enforceable and has sufficiently specific performance obligations in accordance to AASB 15.

When both these conditions are satisfied, the association:

- > identifies each performance obligation relating to the grant;
- > recognises a contract liability for its obligations under the agreement; and
- > recognises revenue as it satisfies its performance obligations.

Where the contract is not enforceable or does not have sufficiently specific performance obligations, the association:

- > recognises the asset received in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable Accounting Standards (for example AASB 9, AASB 16, AASB 116 and AASB 138);
- > recognises related amounts (being contributions by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer); and
- > recognises income immediately in profit or loss as the difference between the initial carrying amount of the asset and the related amount.

If a contract liability is recognised as a related amount above, the association recognises income in profit or loss when or as it satisfies its obligations under the contract.

Interest income

Interest income is recognised using the effective interest method.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

f. Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The committee members evaluate estimates and judgments in the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the association.

The estimate of the useful life of plant and equipment is reviewed at least annually to confirm that the remaining life of material assets is reflected on the asset register. There were no other critical accounting estimates to be considered by the committee during the period or during preparation of this financial report.

The methods of depreciation are used to provide a consistent usage of the useful life of plant and equipment. The methods also allow, where required, for the plant and equipment to be fully written down at a specific point in time such as the end of the lease term. There were no other critical accounting judgments made by the committee members.

g. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee members assess whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount in accordance with another Standard (e.g. in accordance with the revaluation model in AASB 116). Any impairment loss of a revalued asset is treated as a revaluation decrease in accordance with that other Standard.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the committee members estimate the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. The committee members found no indication that any asset had been impaired.

h. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of twelve months or less.

i. Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from other entities. Receivables expected to be collected within twelve months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

j. Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

k. Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair values less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairment losses.

In the event the carrying amount of plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount, the carrying amount is written down immediately to its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses recognised either in profit or loss or as a revaluation decrease if the impairment losses relate to a revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present (refer to Note 1g for details of impairment).

k. Property, Plant and Equipment (continued)

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment that have been contributed at no cost, or for nominal cost, are valued at the fair value of the asset at the date it is acquired.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the association and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other costs are classified as repairs and maintenance and are charged to the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income during the financial period in which they are incurred.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained surplus.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including leasehold improvements is depreciated on a straight line basis (prime rate) over their useful lives to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting period.

I. Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within thirty days of recognition of the liability.

m. Employee Benefits

Retirement benefit obligations - superannuation benefits

All employees of the association receive defined contribution superannuation entitlements, for which the association pays the fixed superannuation guarantee contribution (currently 10.0% [10.5% from 01 July 2022] of the employee's average ordinary salary) to the employee's superannuation fund of choice. All obligations for unpaid superannuation guarantee contributions are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled and are presented as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the association's obligation for short-term employee benefits. Short-term employee benefits are benefits (other than termination benefits) that are expected to be settled wholly within twelve months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service, including wages, salaries, annual leave and long service leave. Short-term employee benefits are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled. The association's obligations for short-term employee benefits are presented as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

m. Employee Benefits (continued)

Long-term employee benefits

The association only classifies employees' long service leave entitlements as long-term employee benefits as they are not expected to be settled wholly within twelve months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service. Provision is made for the association's obligation for long-term employee benefits, which are measured at the present value of the expected future payments to be made to employees. Expected future payments incorporate anticipated future wage and salary levels, durations of service and employee departures, and are discounted at rates determined by reference to market yields at the end of the reporting period on government bonds that have maturity dates that approximate the terms of the obligations. Upon the remeasurement of obligations for long-term employee benefits, the net change in the obligation is recognised in profit or loss classified under employee benefits expense.

The association's obligations for long-term employee benefits are presented as provisions under non-current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position, except where the association does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months after the end of the reporting period, in which case the obligations are presented as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

n. Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions recognised represent the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

o. Leases

The association as lessee

At inception of a contract, the association would assess if the contract contains or is a lease. If there is a lease present, a right-of-use asset and a corresponding lease liability is recognised by the association where the association is a lessee. However, all contracts that are classified as short-term leases (i.e. a lease with a remaining lease term of twelve months or less), leases of low-value assets and concessionary (peppercorn) leases are recognised as an operating expense on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

Concessionary leases

For leases that have significantly below-market terms and conditions principally to enable the association to further its objectives (also referred to as peppercorn leases), the association has adopted the temporary relief under AASB 2018-8 and measures the right-of-use assets at cost on initial recognition.

The association is dependent on this lease to further its objectives. Without this concessionary lease, it would be unlikely for the association to provide surf life saving services.

The association as lessor

The association leases a portion of the building to the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc.

Rental income received from the operating lease is recognised on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

p. Financial Instruments

Initial recognition and measurement

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the association becomes a party to the contractual provisions to the instrument. For financial assets, this is equivalent to the date that the association commits itself to either purchase or sell the asset (i.e. trade date accounting is adopted). Financial instruments are initially measured at fair value plus transactions costs except where the instrument is classified "at fair value through profit or loss" in which case transaction costs are recognised immediately as expenses in profit or loss.

Classification and subsequent measurement

Financial instruments are subsequently measured at fair value, amortised cost using the effective interest method, or cost. Where available, quoted prices in an active market are used to determine fair value. In other circumstances, valuation techniques are adopted.

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market and are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss through the amortisation process and when the financial asset is derecognised.

Financial liabilities

Non-derivative financial liabilities other than financial guarantees are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss through the amortisation process and when the financial liability is derecognised.

Impairment

At the end of each reporting period, the association assesses whether there is objective evidence that a financial asset has been impaired. A financial asset or a group of financial assets is deemed to be impaired if, and only if, there is objective evidence that impairment as a result of one or more events (a "loss event") has occurred, which has an impact on the estimated future cash flows of the financial asset(s).

q. New and Amended Accounting Policies Adopted by the Association Initial adoption of AASB 1060: General Purpose Financial Statements – Simplified Disclosures for For-Profit and Not-for-Profit Tier 2 Entities

The Association has adopted AASB 1060: General Purpose Financial Statements – Simplified Disclosures for For-Profit and Not-for-Profit Tier 2 Entities for the first time this reporting period. The Standard, which sets out a new separate disclosure Standard to be applied by all entities that are reporting under Tier 2 of the Differential Reporting Framework in AASB 1053: Application of Tiers of Australian Accounting Standards, replaces the previous Reduced Disclosure Requirements (RDR) framework. The application of this standard has resulted in reductions in disclosures compared to RDR in Revenue, Leases and Financial Instruments; however has resulted in new and/or increased disclosures in areas such as Audit Fees and Related Parties.

- **a.** The association has a loan facility of up to \$8,500,000 with the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc to fund the new building and to assist in the repayment of the bank loans described above. The loan taken is non-recourse interest free loan which will be repaid as specified in the loan agreement. The loan has been disclosed as a current and a non-current loan.
- **b.** The bank loans comprise of two loans, for \$6,000,000 and for \$2,000,000, both being principal and interest. The loan facilities expire on 27 February 2028. Accordingly, the principal and interest loans have been disclosed as a current and a non-current loan. Further, the association has \$1,002,018 available for redraw if required.

A loan covenant exists over the loans which requires the 'Debt Service Cover ratio of the Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc and the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc is at all times not less than 1.25 times where the Debt Service Cover = (EBITDA less tax divided by gross interest plus twelve months principal payments plus line fees). The loan covenant is reviewed on a monthly basis and no breach of the covenant has been identified during the financial period or to the date of this financial report.

Westpac Banking Corporation holds the following securities over the loans:

NOTE 22: GOING CONCERN

Current asset ratio

The financial report has been prepared on the going concern basis of accounting. The Current Asset Ratio (current assets: current liabilities) was 0.21 to 1.00 as at 30 June 2022 (as at 31 March 2022: 0.16 to 1.00). This is due to the construction of the new club which has been financed and a portion of the loan is disclosed as a current liability.

There is a 'donations agreement' in place and details are disclosed in Note 6. Further, an amount of \$1,002,018 is available for redraw if required for operational purposes, refer Note 11b.

The ability of Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc to realise its assets and extinguish its liabilities in the normal course of business and at the amounts stated in the financial report is contingent on the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Corporate Information

The financial report is for Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity, incorporated and domiciled in Australia. Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is an association incorporated in Queensland under the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Qld). The association is a charity registered under the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 (Cth).

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – AASB 1060: General Purpose Financial Statements – Simplified Disclosures for For-Profit and Not-for-Profit Tier 2 Entities of the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB). The Charity is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements, except for the cash flow information, have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

Accounting Policies

a. Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the Charity is exempt from income tax under Section 50-10 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997* (Cth). Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a Public Benevolent Institution (PBI) and has been endorsed by the Australian Taxation Office to receive tax concessions. Further, Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is endorsed as a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR).

b. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the Statement of Financial Position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO are presented as operating cash flows included in receipts from customers or payments to suppliers.

c. Economic Dependence

Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc is dependent on the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc for funds used to meet it's financial commitments. At the date of this report the committee members have no reason to believe the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc will not continue to support Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc.

d. Comparative Figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year. When required, comparative information is reclassified where appropriate to enhance comparability. Note, the current financial year is for twelve (12) months where the comparative financial year is for three (3) months.

e. Revenue

Revenue recognition

Contributed assets

The Charity receives assets from the government and other parties for nil or nominal consideration in order to further its objectives. These assets are recognised in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable accounting standards (eg AASB 9, AASB 16, AASB 116, AASB 1058 and AASB 138).

On initial recognition of an asset, the Charity recognises related amounts (being contributions by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer).

The Charity recognises income immediately in profit or loss as the difference between the initial carrying amount of the asset and the related amount.

Capital grant

Grant revenue received from government that relates to the purchase of capital assets is offset against the amount of the capital asset. The grant is recognised in profit or loss over the life of the depreciable asset as a reduced depreciation expense.

Operating grants, donations and bequests

When the Charity receives operating grant revenue, donations or bequests, it assesses whether the contract is enforceable and has sufficiently specific performance obligations in accordance to AASB 15.

When both these conditions are satisfied, the Charity:

- > identifies each performance obligation relating to the grant;
- > recognises a contract liability for its obligations under the agreement; and
- > recognises revenue as it satisfies its performance obligations.

Where the contract is not enforceable or does not have sufficiently specific performance obligations, the Charity:

- > recognises the asset received in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable Accounting Standards (for example AASB 9, AASB 16, AASB 116 and AASB 138);
- > recognises related amounts (being contributions by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer); and
- > recognises income immediately in profit or loss as the difference between the initial carrying amount of the asset and the related amount.

If a contract liability is recognised as a related amount above, the Charity recognises income in profit or loss when or as it satisfies its obligations under the contract.

Interest income

Interest income is recognised using the effective interest method.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

f. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the Charity reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and its value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in profit or loss.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the Charity estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

f. Impairment of Assets (continued)

Where the future economic benefits of the asset are not primarily dependent upon the asset's ability to generate net cash inflows and when the Association would, if deprived of the asset, replace its remaining future economic benefits, value in use is determined as the depreciated replacement cost of an asset.

Where an impairment loss on a revalued asset is identified, this is recognised against the revaluation surplus in respect of the same class of asset to the extent that the impairment loss does not exceed the amount in the revaluation surplus for that class of asset.

g. Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The committee members evaluate estimates and judgments in the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the Charity.

The estimate of the useful life of plant and equipment is reviewed at least annually to confirm that the remaining life of material assets is reflected on the asset register. There were no other critical accounting estimates to be considered by the committee during the year or during preparation of this financial report.

The methods of depreciation are used to provide a consistent usage of the useful life of plant and equipment. The methods also allow, where required, for the plant and equipment to be fully written down at a specific point in time such as the end of the lease term. There were no other critical accounting judgments made by the committee members.

h. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of twelve months or less.

i. Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from other entities. Receivables expected to be collected within twelve months of the end of the reporting year are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

j. Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

k. Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair values less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairment losses.

In the event the carrying amount of plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount, the carrying amount is written down immediately to its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses recognised either in profit or loss or as a revaluation decrease if the impairment losses relate to a revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present (refer to Note 1f for details of impairment).

Leasehold improvements, plant and equipment that have been contributed at no cost, or for nominal cost, are valued at the fair value of the asset at the date it is acquired.

k. Property, Plant and Equipment (continued)

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Charity and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other costs are classified as repairs and maintenance and are charged to the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income during the financial year in which they are incurred.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the Statement of Profit or Loss and Other Comprehensive Income. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained surplus.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including leasehold improvements is depreciated on a straight line basis (prime rate) over their useful lives to the Charity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over either the unexpired year of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting year.

I. Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the Charity during the reporting year that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting year. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within thirty days of recognition of the liability.

m. Employee Benefits

Retirement benefit obligations - superannuation benefits

All employees of the Charity receive defined contribution superannuation entitlements, for which the Charity pays the fixed superannuation guarantee contribution (during the year 10.5% [11.0% from 01 July 2023] of the employee's ordinary times earnings) to the employee's superannuation fund of choice. All obligations for unpaid superannuation guarantee contributions are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled and are presented as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the Charity's obligation for short-term employee benefits. Short-term employee benefits are benefits (other than termination benefits) that are expected to be settled wholly within twelve months after the end of the annual reporting year in which the employees render the related service, including wages, salaries, annual leave and long service leave. Short-term employee benefits are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled. The Charity's obligations for short-term employee benefits are presented as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

m. Employee Benefits (continued)

Long-term employee benefits

The Charity only classifies employees' long service leave entitlements as long-term employee benefits as they are not expected to be settled wholly within twelve months after the end of the annual reporting year in which the employees render the related service. Provision is made for the Charity's obligation for long-term employee benefits, which are measured at the present value of the expected future payments to be made to employees. Expected future payments incorporate anticipated future wage and salary levels, durations of service and employee departures, and are discounted at rates determined by reference to market yields at the end of the reporting year on government bonds that have maturity dates that approximate the terms of the obligations. Upon the remeasurement of obligations for long-term employee benefits, the net change in the obligation is recognised in profit or loss classified under employee benefits expense.

The Charity's obligations for long-term employee benefits are presented as provisions under non-current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position, except where the Charity does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months after the end of the reporting year, in which case the obligations are presented as trade and other payables under current liabilities in the Statement of Financial Position.

n. Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Charity has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions recognised represent the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting year.

o. Leases

The Charity as lessee

At inception of a contract, the Charity would assess if the contract contains or is a lease. If there is a lease present, a right-of-use asset and a corresponding lease liability is recognised by the Charity where the Charity is a lessee. However, all contracts that are classified as short-term leases (i.e. a lease with a remaining lease term of twelve months or less), leases of low-value assets and concessionary (peppercorn) leases are recognised as an operating expense on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

Concessionary leases

For leases that have significantly below-market terms and conditions principally to enable the Charity to further its objectives (also referred to as peppercorn leases), the Charity has adopted the temporary relief under AASB 2018-8 and measures the right-of-use assets at cost on initial recognition.

The Charity is dependent on this lease to further its objectives. Without this concessionary lease, it would be unlikely for the Charity to provide surf life saving services.

The Charity as lessor

The Charity leases a portion of the building to the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Charity Inc.

Rental income received from the operating lease is recognised on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

p. Financial Instruments

Initial recognition and measurement

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the Charity becomes a party to the contractual provisions to the instrument. For financial assets, this is equivalent to the date that the Charity commits itself to either purchase or sell the asset (i.e. trade date accounting is adopted). Financial instruments are initially measured at fair value plus transactions costs except where the instrument is classified "at fair value through profit or loss" in which case transaction costs are recognised immediately as expenses in profit or loss.

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

p. Financial Instruments (continued)

Classification and subsequent measurement

Financial instruments are subsequently measured at fair value, amortised cost using the effective interest method, or cost. Where available, quoted prices in an active market are used to determine fair value. In other circumstances, valuation techniques are adopted.

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market and are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss through the amortisation process and when the financial asset is derecognised.

Financial liabilities

Non-derivative financial liabilities other than financial guarantees are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss through the amortisation process and when the financial liability is derecognised.

Impairment

At the end of each reporting year, the Charity assesses whether there is objective evidence that a financial asset has been impaired. A financial asset or a group of financial assets is deemed to be impaired if, and only if, there is objective evidence that impairment as a result of one or more events (a "loss event") has occurred, which has an impact on the estimated future cash flows of the financial asset/s.

q. New and Amended Accounting Standards Adopted by the Charity

AASB 2022-3: Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards – Illustrative Examples for Not-for-Profit Entities accompanying AASB 15

AASB 2022-3 amends the Australian illustrative examples for not-for-profit entities accompanying AASB 15: Revenue from Contracts with Customers to illustrate how AASB 15 applies to the recognition and measurement of upfront fees. The amendments do not change the requirements of AASB 15.

The Basis for Conclusions also document the Board's decision to retain the accounting policy choice on an ongoing basis for NFP private sector lessees to elect to initially measure a class of ROU assets arising under concessionary leases at cost or at fair value.

The adoption of the amendment did not have a material impact on the financial statements.

Donations Agreement

The Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc has agreed to donate approximately \$90,000 per month to directly assist the club to meet the loan repayments to the Westpac Banking Corporation. The term of the agreement is 'until loans are fully repaid'.

Operating Lease Receivable

The Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc provides a rental income to the club pursuant to the sub-lease agreement that expires on 29 June 2036. The annual lease amount is considered 'commercial-in-confidence' although it does increase by a fixed amount of 2.5% on each anniversary date. Due to the nature of the agreement no amount has been recognised as a receivable as it will be recognised as revenue when invoiced. Unpaid rental payments are recognised as a current receivable.

- **a.** The Charity has a loan facility of up to \$8,500,000 with the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc to fund the new building and to assist in the repayment of the bank loans described above. The loan taken is non-recourse interest free loan which will be repaid as specified in the loan agreement. The loan has been disclosed as a current and a non-current loan.
- **b.** The bank loans comprise of two loans, for \$6,000,000 and for \$2,000,000, both being principal and interest. The loan facilities expire on 27 February 2028. Accordingly, the principal and interest loans have been disclosed as a current and a non-current loan. Further, the Charity has \$752,022 available for redraw if required.

A loan covenant exists over the loans which requires the 'Debt Service Cover ratio of the Kurrawa Surf Life Saving Club Inc and the Kurrawa S.L.S.C. Supporters Association Inc is at all times not less than 1.25 times where the Debt Service Cover = (EBITDA less tax divided by gross interest plus twelve months principal payments plus line fees). The loan covenant is reviewed on a monthly basis and no breach of the covenant has been identified during the financial year or to the date of this financial report.

Westpac Banking Corporation holds the following securities over the loans:

Throughout her time as a volunteer surf life saver Kelly completed over 400 volunteer patrol hours on the beach and completed many awards.

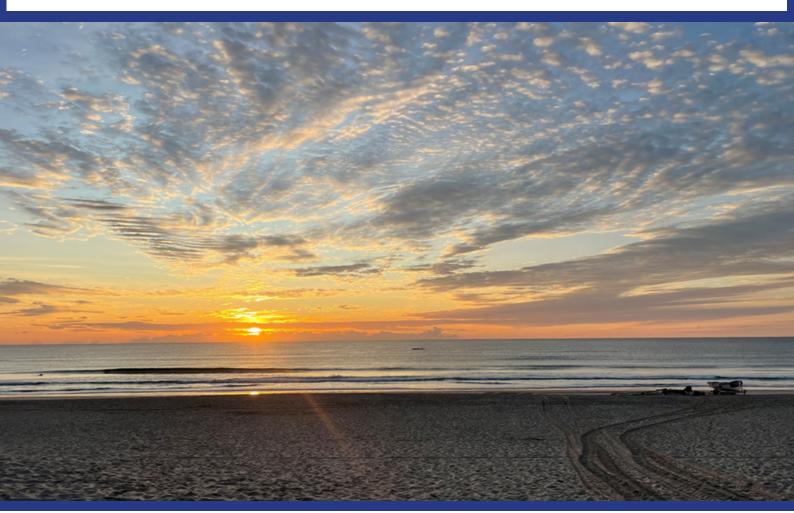
